Today, Union Station Homeless Services is the San Gabriel Valley's largest, most comprehensive social service organization helping homeless men, women and children rebuild their lives.

We offer people everything they need from the time they come in off the street until the time they have keys to their own apartment. **Our programs rebuild lives.**

OUR PROGRAMS

Passageways

1020 Arroyo Parkway

When someone is homeless and in need of help, Passageways is the first step of the journey. This one-stop service center that offers a single entry point to Pasadena's homeless services network. Passageways provides outreach, intake and assessment, and medical and mental health services for nearly 1,900 homeless men, women and children each year. It is operated in partnership with Pacific Clinics.

Adult Center

412 S. Raymond Ave.

Each year, more than 150 adults rebuild their lives at the Adult Center, a 56-bed adult shelter. Offering 36 beds for men and 20 beds for women, residents receive safe shelter and the supportive services needed to achieve self-sufficiency. This location also serves as the site for our Shower and Community Meals Programs.

Family Center

825 E. Orange Grove Blvd.

The Family Center is a nurturing home-like environment that offers shelter for up to 50 parents and children each night, and approximately 125 people (40 families) each year. Supportive services are offered onsite to promote physical, emotional, and financial wellbeing for parents and their children.

Euclid Villa

154 S. Euclid Ave.

Euclid Villa is a transitional housing program that offers affordable apartments for up to 14 homeless, very low-income families. Residents pay 30% of their income towards rent and may stay for up to two years. Case management and supportive services are provided on-site. Euclid Villa is owned and operated by Union Station and Pacific Housing Alliance.

Sources

825 E. Orange Grove Blvd.

Sources is a career development program designed to meet the employment needs of homeless and very low-income job seekers. Each year, 125 work-ready adults participated in workshops, individualized job search assistance, and career counseling to find employment and advance their career.

Centennial Place

235 E. Holly Street

Union Station provides case management and onsite services at Centennial Place, a permanent supportive housing facility offering 142 single room occupancy (SRO) apartments for low-income adults. Centennial Place is owned and operated by Abode Communities.



OUR SERVICES

Union Station provides a comprehensive range of services to help homeless individuals and families achieve self-sufficiency, including:

- Outreach, intake & assessment
- Emergency shelter
- Transitional housing
- Permanent supportive housing
- Meal service for residents & community members
- Showers & personal hygiene
- Case management & referrals
- Medical & mental health services
- Benefits advocacy
- Substance abuse recovery support
- Career counseling/job search assistance
- Services tailored to women & families
- Enrichment activities for children
- Life skills classes in money management, parenting, & nutrition
- Housing placement resources

OUR RECORD OF SUCCESS

INTAKE: Nearly 1,900 people each year receive help in finding shelter, benefits, health care, mental health services, substance abuse and addiction recovery at our Passageways intake center.

SHELTER: About 300 men, women and children receive safe shelter at Union Station Homeless Services each year. Approximately 66% of single adults and 84% of families exit to stable housing.

HOUSING: Last year, Euclid Villa provided safe residence for 21 families transitioning out of homelessness; 100% moved on to permanent housing. Since 2010, we have placed 94 single adults at Centennial Place. We are currently developing permanent supportive housing for families.

MEALS: We serve more than 166,000 meals each year, including daily meals for our residents and hungry community members, as well as holiday meals on Thanksgiving and Christmas.

SUSTAINABILITY: Union Station has a diverse range of support from individuals, foundations, corporations, and government funding sources. Last year, 75% of our \$4.6 million dollar budget was received from private sources. 75 cents of every dollar donated directly supports our programs.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT: 250 organizations and 1,300 individuals volunteer over 40,000 hours of service each year. Union Station receives in-kind donations are valued at more than \$400,000 annually.
